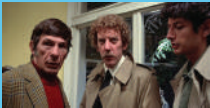

The Lost Boys

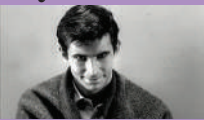

When Marion is gruesomely killed in the shower, the narrative shockingly shifts to her sister Lila (Vera Miles) and boyfriend Sam (John Gavin) as they search for the missing woman. Director Alfred Hitchcock subverted audience expectations, solidifying his reputation as the "Master of Suspense" and forever changing the horror genre with his bold storytelling. The film's infamous twist and groundbreaking shower scene have cemented its place as one of the most iconic and influential thrillers in cinematic history.
